

Hardwick Primary School – PE and Sport Premium Plan - 2021/2022

Introduction

The PE Premium funding provides an excellent opportunity for the school to further improve its PE provision and to do so in the wider context of the Bury Schools Partnership, fully utilising the skills and experience across the group of schools.

School Vision and Aims

Our vision and long term aims for the development of high quality physical education and physical activity at Hardwick.

Through the delivery of high quality PE and an increased level of sports available for the children to participate in out of school hours, every child will leave our school enthused, motivated and inspired to continue participating in sports.

Key objectives

In order for Hardwick to achieve and maintain our vision we will focus on the following areas:

- Pupils have high quality PE lessons in school
- Pupils have access to a planned programme of high quality intra and inter-school sports competitions across the year. School Games Mark level achieved.
- Access to coaching and specialist teachers and sports leaders from secondary schools.
- PE Leader attends BSP and Trust quarterly meetings and plans and co-ordinates activities alongside sports co-ordinator/school games coordinator.
- Planning and delivery of PE across the school is of consistently high quality, through up-skilled staff and the pupil's skills will be developed to a higher standard.
- Through sport coaches we deliver clubs to increase the level of participation by the pupils in sports and keeping active and healthy related activities.
- Increase structured physical activity during school and at playtimes and lunchtimes.
- Encourage more participation at the school football club
- Improve pupils' mental health and wellbeing through being outdoors, through gardening
- Provide Forest School sessions to improve pupils' mental health and being active
- Ensure pupils can enjoy cycling and be safe cyclists
- Ensure pupils can meet the DfE's swimming requirements by the end of Year 6
- Provide outdoor physical activities for EYFS
- Provide various outdoor physical activities for targeted year groups to raise interests and participation
- Highlight the importance of physical activity and healthy living

Use of funding/Actions	Impact
Purchase a new PE curriculum scheme of work – Get Set 4 PE	The new scheme of work has made planning for PE clearer and the plans are a lot easier to follow and implement by teachers. The progression of skills is also clearer too. After the first year of using the new scheme, teachers have reported an increase in pupil engagement and participation and pupils' skills have improved.
Release time for PE leader to monitor teaching of PE and have time to discuss planning and delivery of PE with key staff team. Aim for Sainsbury's School Games Silver Mark.	Due to covid restrictions in the autumn and spring terms the Schools Games competitions and events did not take place. This is something the school wishes to be involved in again in 2022/23. Sainsbury's School Games mark was therefore not applied for.
Using specialist coaches to offer specific CPD and work alongside staff to upskill them and develop staff confidence in sports/PE. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CPD cost and supply release time for teachers • Resources 	A&M Multisports worked alongside staff to upskill them and develop their confidence in teaching elements of PE, such as gymnastics and invasion games. Teachers felt they had gained confidence and were more able to teach sports.
Subsidising the cost of after school sports clubs delivered by trained sports coaches. Includes various sporting activities	A&M Multisports have provided clubs from the spring term 2022 for pupils in Year 1-6. 76 pupils attended the clubs. Parents commented on how pleased they were that their children were able to attend a subsidised club.
Provide outdoor activity sessions for Year 4 and Year 6 at activity centres, including transport.	Y4 attended Burwell house and Y6 Hilltop. All the children attended and had a great time, building n team skills, self-esteem and social skills.
Provide annual Healthy Living Week, including activities for the whole school.	In June the children across the school took part in various activities over the week, including sports days. They also looked healthy eating and how to be active and the importance of keeping fit and active.
Hardwick Primary Football Club (pupils from YR-Y6) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • FA affiliation costs (inc. insurances, DBS) • Resources inc. training equipment • FA Coaching awards 	The Football Club has been successful again this year, running teams for Reception to Year 6 (66 children are members of the football club). Training and matches take pace on Saturday mornings.
Gymnastics Club (YR-Y6) run by specialist Gymnastics Instructor. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cost of resources • Entry to Gymnastic competitions (local and regional) and specialist coaching. 	Gym Club runs for Reception to Year 6 as an after school club. The club popular and oversubscribed. Additional resources have been purchased to further develop their gymnastic skills and enable the children to perform a wider range of gymnastic movements and routines.

New PE resources and playtime equipment	New PE resources were purchased to plug the gaps in resources and to teach the new PE scheme of work. Pupils now have the correct number of resources to use in PE.
EYFS outdoor equipment to encourage active play	Equipment purchased has enabled children to play and learn outdoors and develop many skills. The impact was seen in observations of children's play and learning and the high percentages that attained a GLD in this area.
Set up Forest Schools, including Level 3 training and equipment	The Reception teacher has completed the level 3 Forest Schools training and the resources purchased have enabled her to run forest schools for her class. Children have enjoyed learning in the outdoors and developing their skills.
Provide extra swimming sessions for Year 5 and Year 6	See impact of swimming below.
New storage sheds for PE equipment and playtime equipment	Both PE sheds were replaced, due to health and safety concerns and being unfit for use. The new sheds are water tight and able to safely store PE and playtime equipment.
Provide gardening equipment for cater for pupils mental health and wellbeing	Gardening equipment, including a greenhouse were purchased. This has allowed us restart our gardening club and there was an increase in the number of pupils wanting to join gardening club. Pupils are enjoying growing their own vegetables which they can take home and use in the school kitchen.
Provide Bikeability cycle training for Year 5 pupils so they can be cycle safely and be active	97% passed their Bikeability training and are now considered to be safe uses on the road.
